Daddona Family Protects 57 Acres of Property

Jack Daddona and his family have protected their 57-acre Upper Milford Township property from development with a perpetual conservation easement. The wooded property is located in an area called the PA Highlands and has important resources deserving of protection because of their numerous benefits in terms of improving water quality and providing animal and plant habitat. A tributary to the Saucon Creek runs through the property and the woodlands provide wildlife habitat and scenic vistas for the region.
