

Safety Overview:

- **Required:** Life vest, Closed toe-shoes, comfortable clothing. Helmet required for kayakers. *We provide all PFDs and equipment for participants utilizing a canoe, included with registration. Anyone bringing their own boat is expected to bring their own safety equipment.*
- **Optional:** Drybag, hat, sunscreen, water bottle, snacks.
- **Note:** Early morning temperatures may be cooler and then warm up during the day. Thick, wool or cotton clothing is not recommended.
- **Water Conditions:** flat water

Welcome to Walnutport Canal Association

Walnutport Canal Association (WCA) was incorporated on February 4th, 1982, "for improving and maintaining the Lehigh Canal in Walnutport and its banks." The Association currently oversees and maintains a canal park consisting of 145 acres and 4.5 miles of canal and adjoining towpath. The area houses the Heritage Center, WCA Pavilion, and Locktender's House. The Walnutport Canal Association, Inc. is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization. Through their generous partnership, we are able to provide camping opportunities for sojourners. Please be aware that the campsites are a shared space, and we ask for your cooperation to help make the experience smooth and enjoyable for all.

What to Expect:

- Parking lot is located next to greenspace beside the WCA Pavilion. Campers may park and unload supplies, choosing their own camp space within the greenspace. Sojourn staff will be on hand to direct you.
- Campers must bring their own camping supplies.
- Bathrooms and potable water are available inside Pavilion. Showers are not.
- Trashcans are located onsite.
- Please note that for the Sojourn, no pets (even leashed) are allowed. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Things to Do:

- Walk: Enjoy a walk along the canal's towpath. [This spur section of D&L Trail](#) follows the canal towpath north and south of Walnutport for a total length of 3.9 miles. To the north, users will catch glimpses of the Lehigh River and the remnants of canal locks. Where the canal and river meet, a small peninsula provides a unique view of the Lehigh Gap. On the southern side of Walnutport, trout and muskrat troll the wide waters of the canal and you won't want to miss the remains of the old aqueduct at Bertsch Creek.
- Fish: Visitors are welcome to fish from the banks. (Fishing license required.)
- Photography: Capture the historic structures at WCA
